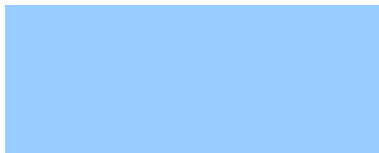

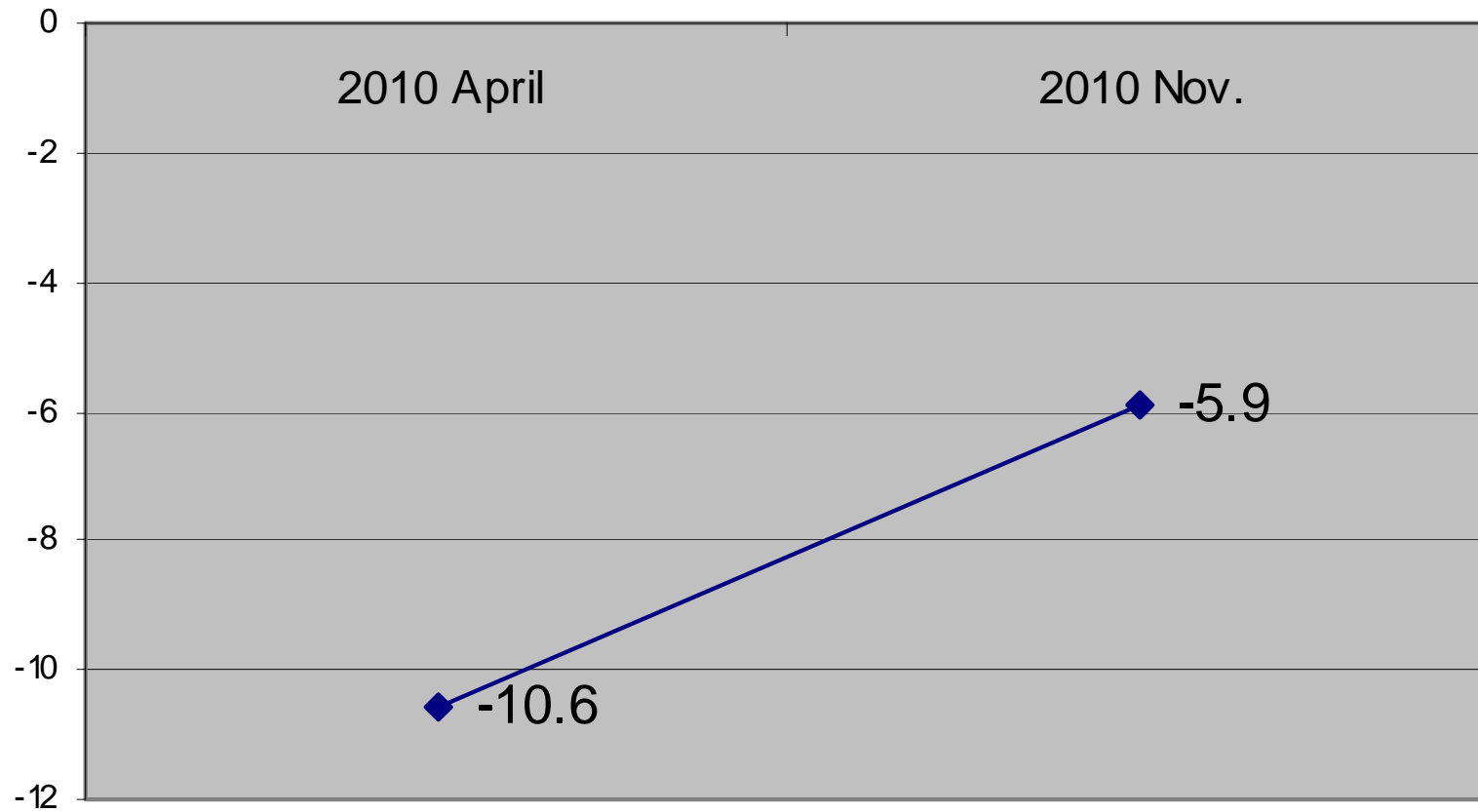

% 2009 GDP growth rate estimates -variation



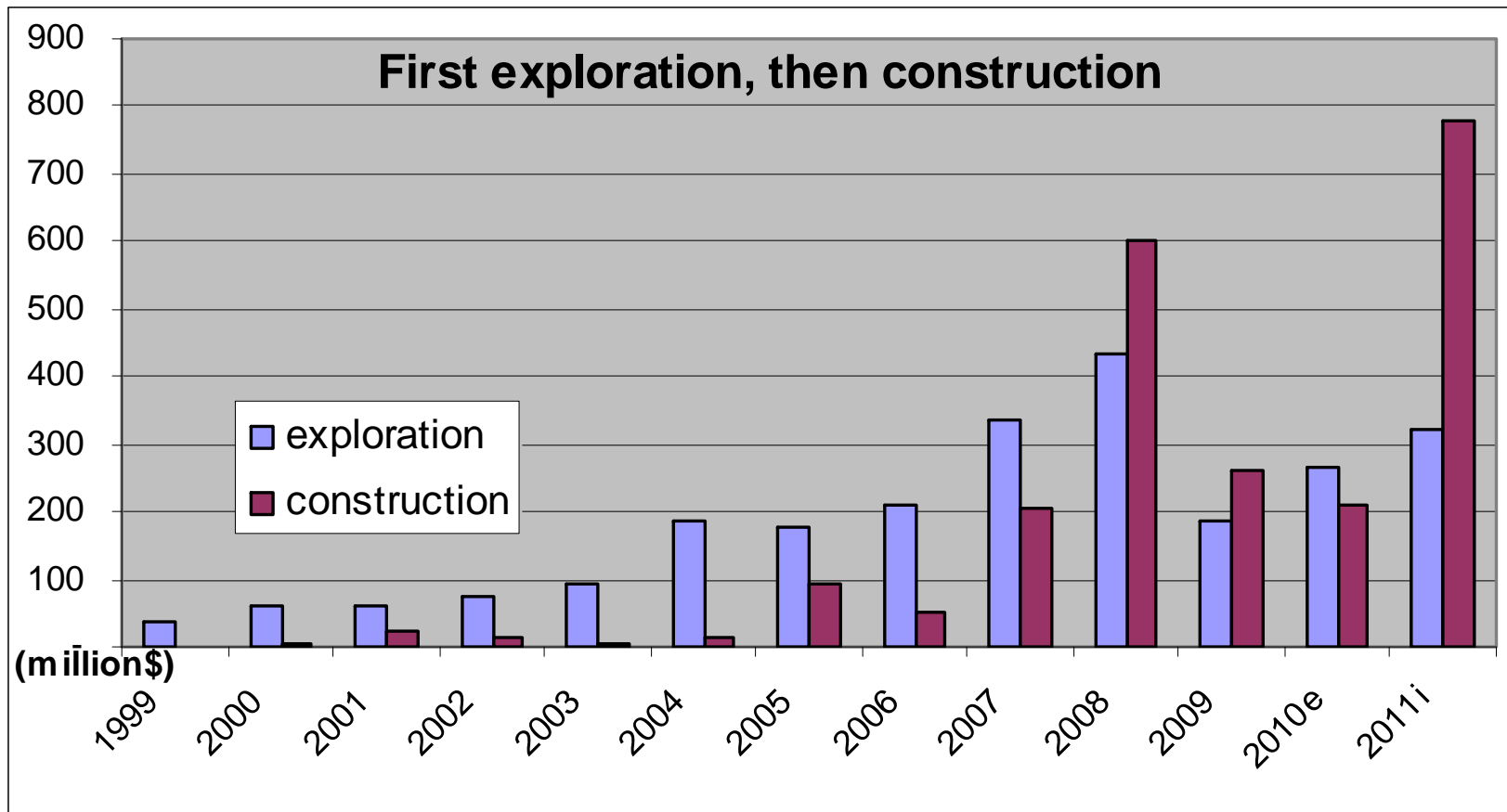

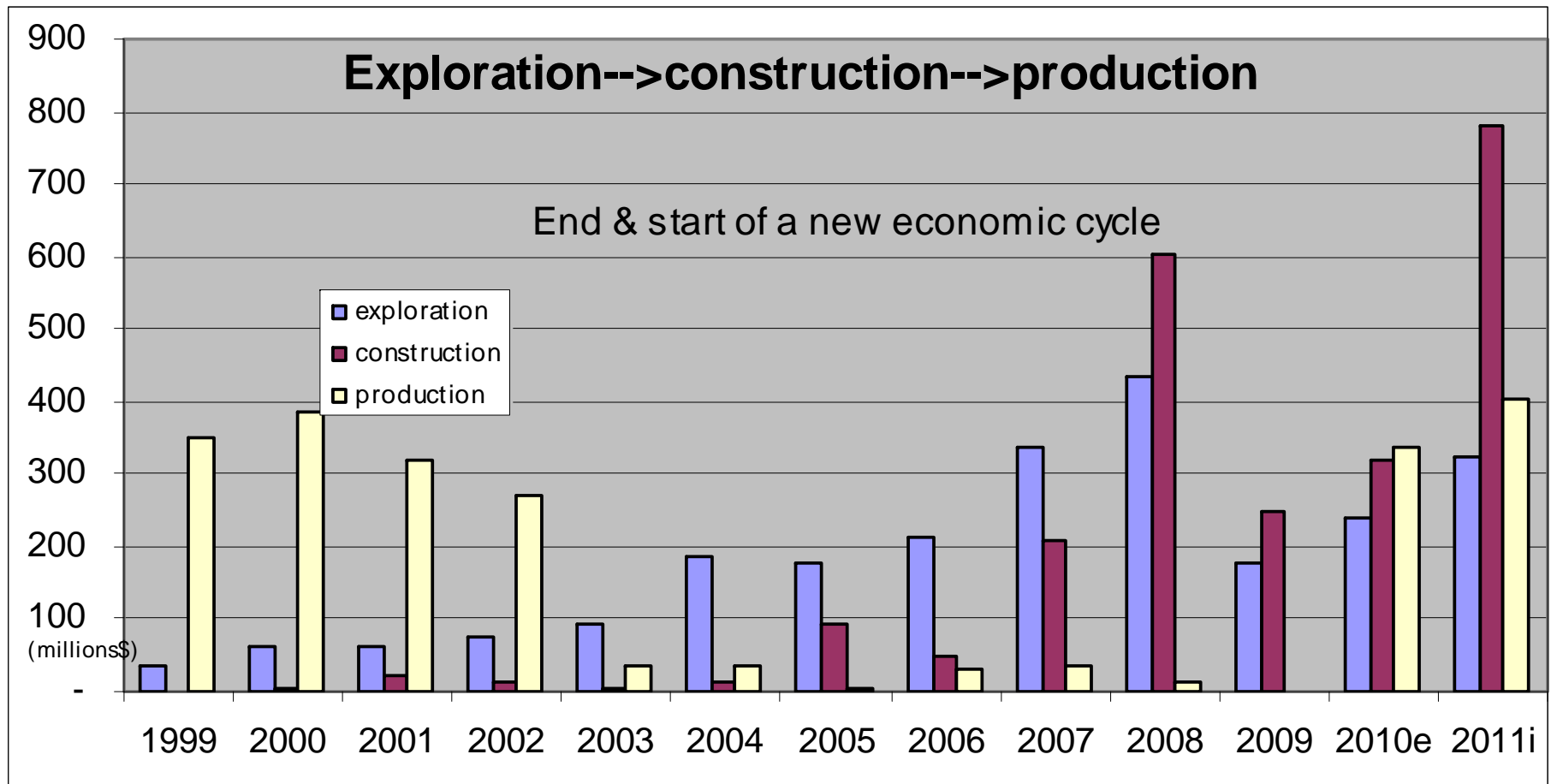

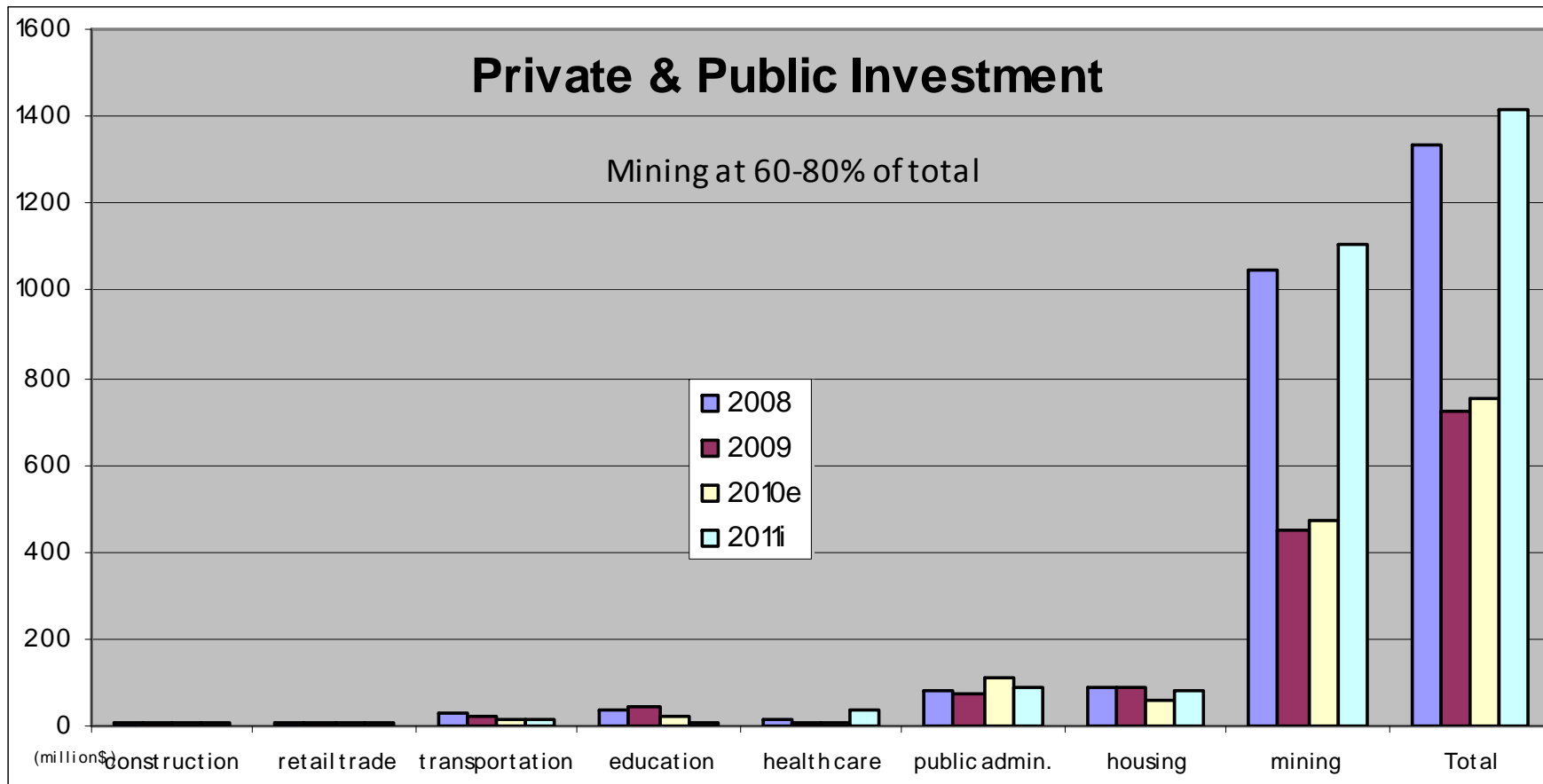

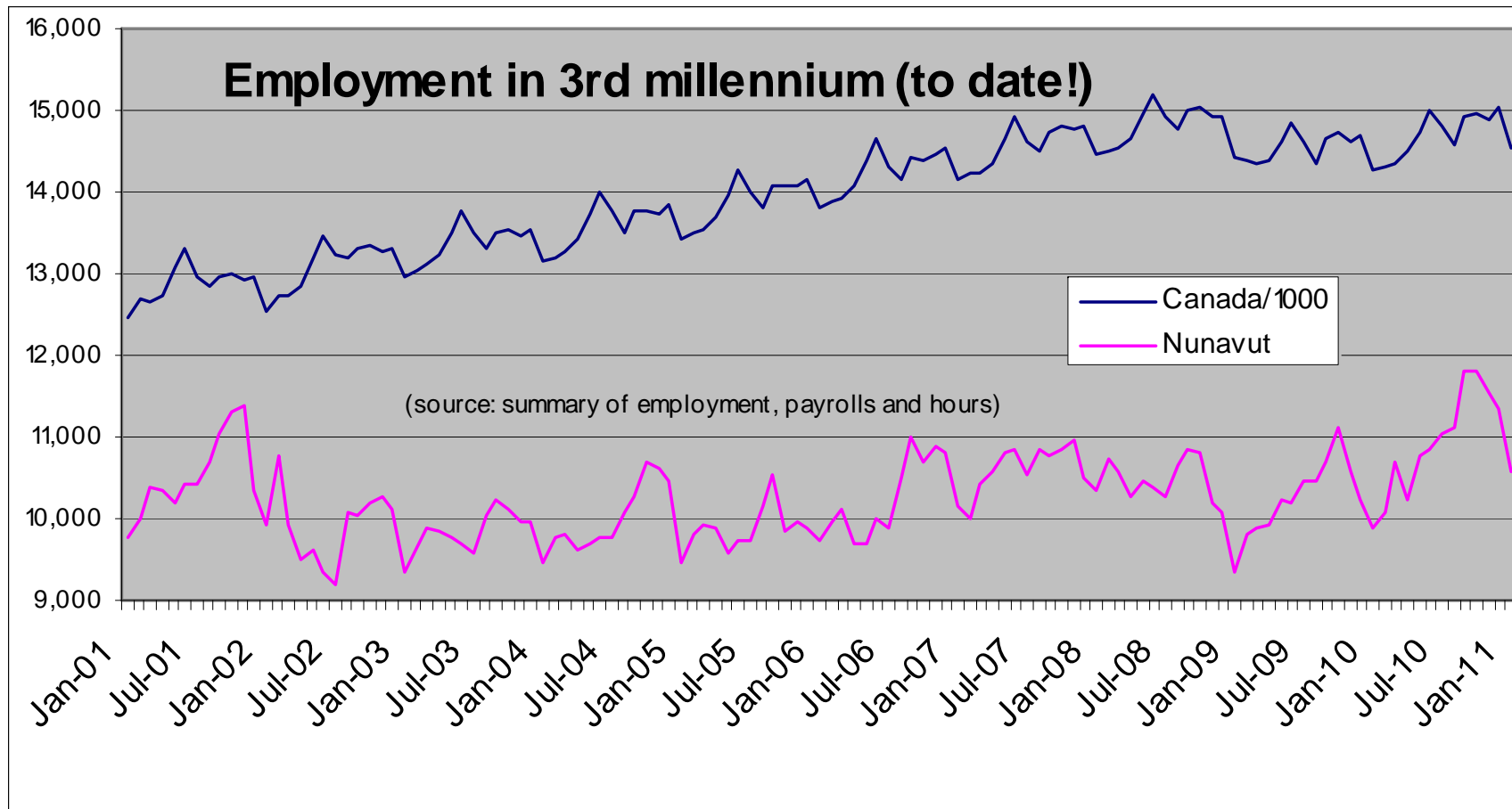

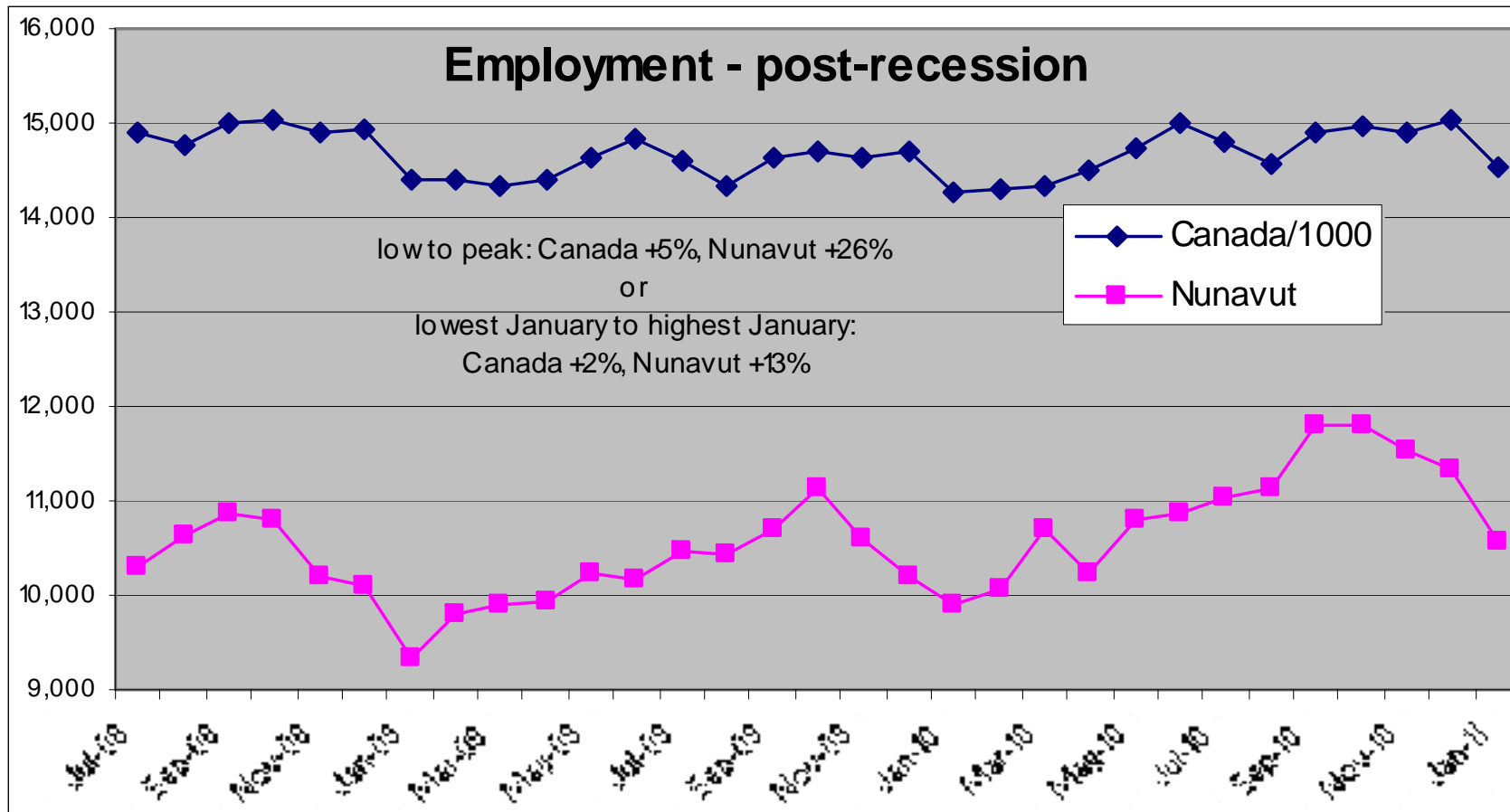

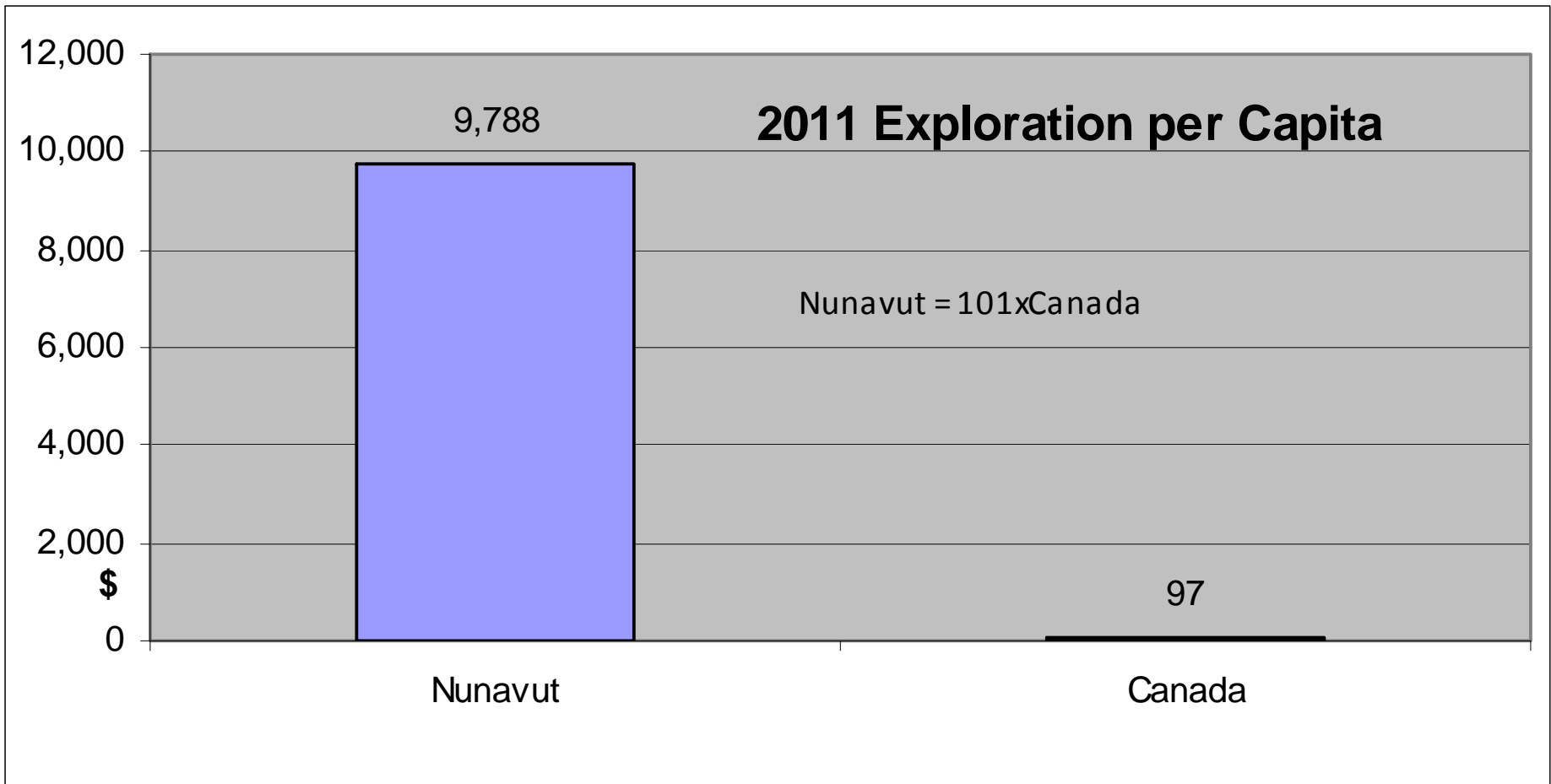

4. Relative importance of mining

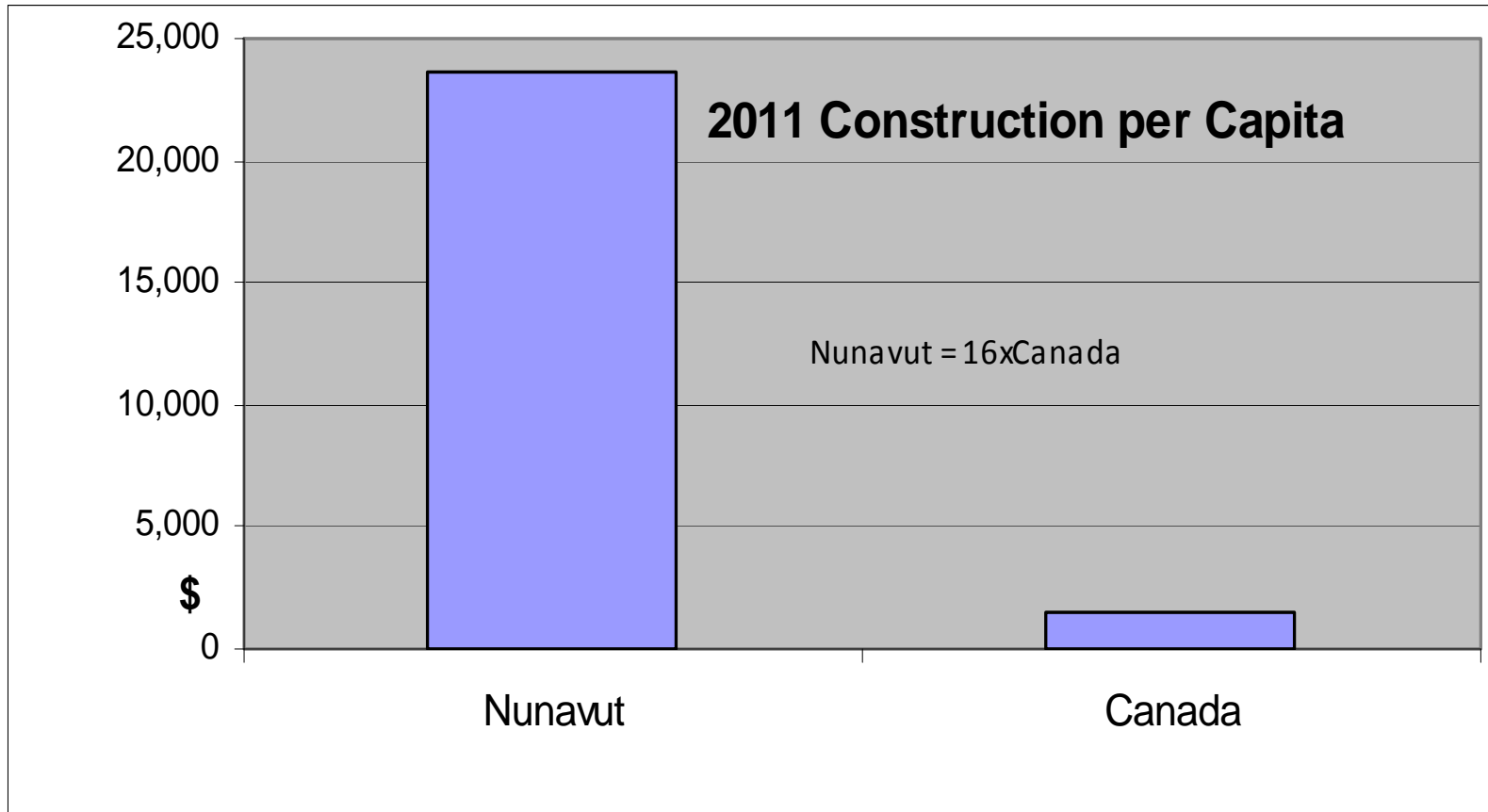

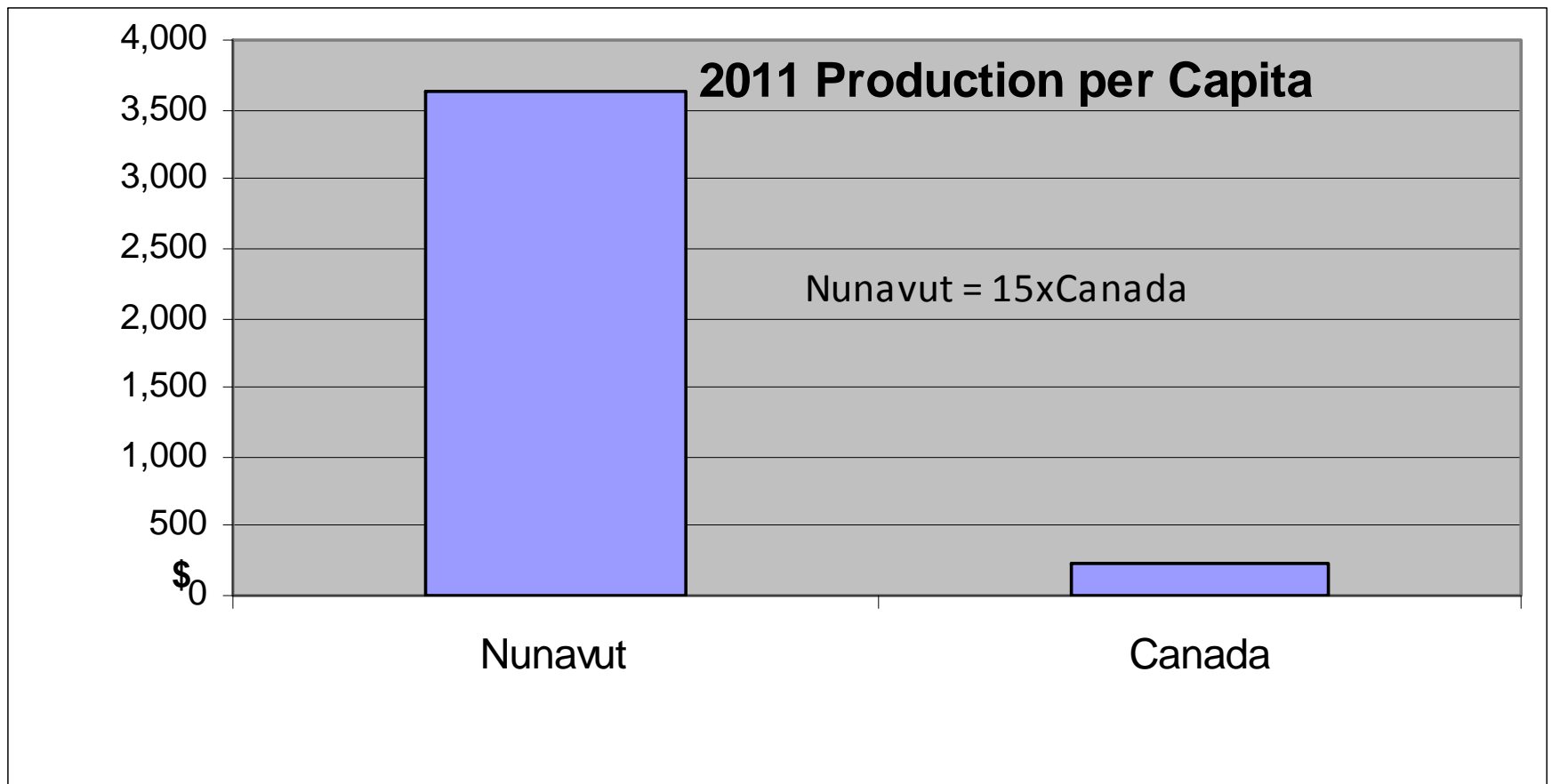

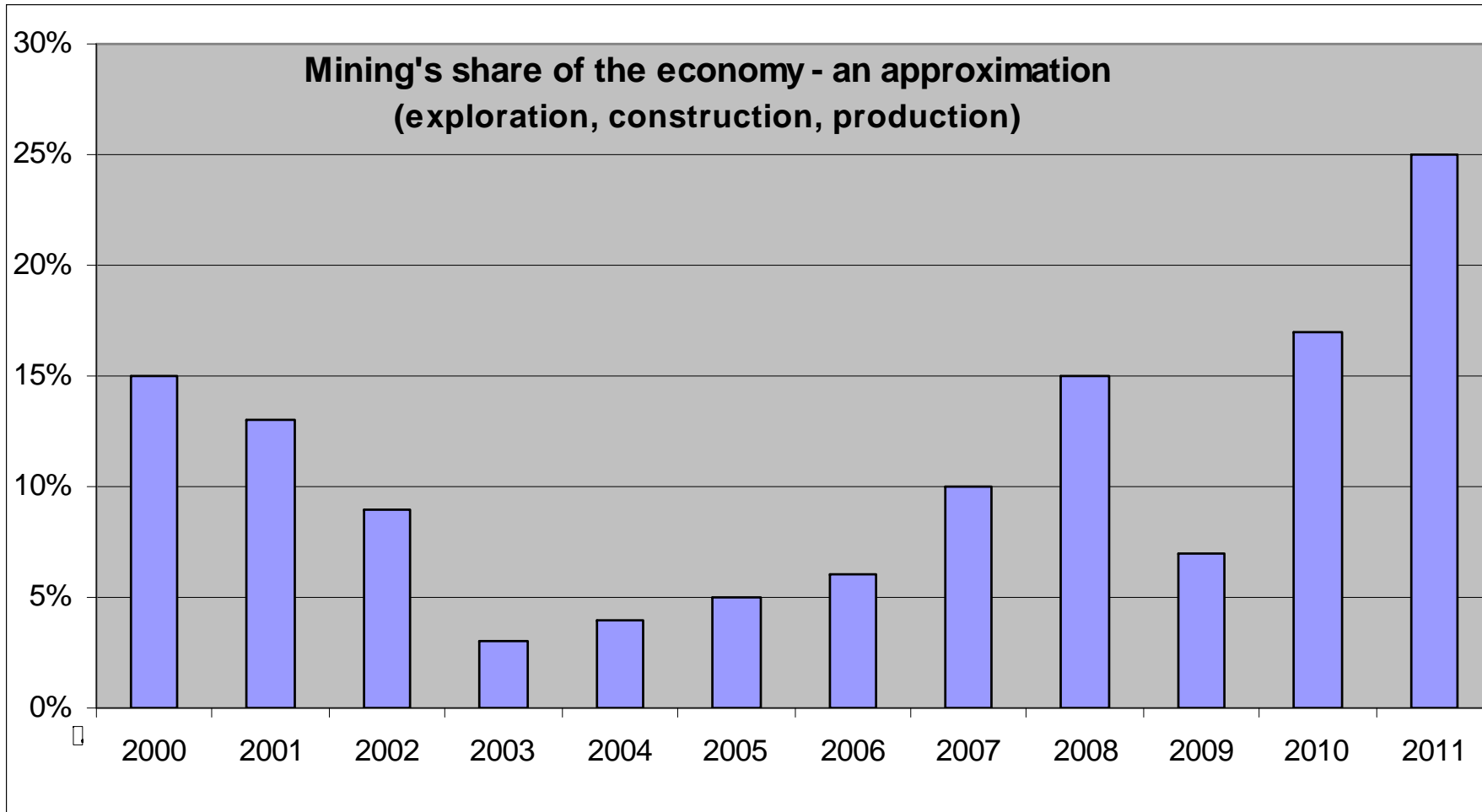

Impressive results and outlook

- 2010-2012 highest level of economic activity and employment in history of Nunavut
- Highest growth in Canada in 2010 (x4)
- Mining sector accounts for most of this economic growth
- Structural change - a plateau followed by further upward steps – mining's role rising

- Emerging territory of Canada, emerging economy of Canada

Investment attractiveness - Nunavut, a very positive investment milieu

- Canada #1 in exploration worldwide; Nunavut, leader in Canada per capita
- Growing international clientele, repeat buyers
- Favorable regulations; one unique land claim agreement inspired by best practices
- Ample resources, geological knowledge still emerging
- Canada's reputation, laws and tax regime make it a very low-risk country
- The architects of the Nunavut Land Claims Agreement created a positive investment environment in designing its mining component with remarkable foresight
