

Qikiqtani association secures \$25M for jobs, training

QIA has run its Q-STEP program in partnership with federal and territorial governments, Kakivak and Baffinland since 2017

The Qikiqtani Inuit Association has secured an additional \$25 million to extend its Q-STEP program over four years.

QIA was approved for \$25 Million in new funding from the GOC to continue Q-STEP from 2023 to 2028. More training opportunities will be available in all Qikiqtani communities

Q-STEP will provide training for heavy equipment operator, driver training, work readiness, pre-trades instruction, apprenticeships and include an Inuit Training and Development Program. Q-STEP bilingual staff provide culturally relevant supports to Inuit for training and employment.

There are 10 Inuit Apprentices on site at Baffinland's Mary River Project: 5 are in first-year studies, 5 are in second-year studies.



They are expected to continue with the program to 2028 (\$2.6M program budget).




Apprenticeship areas include: carpentry, electricians, heavy duty mechanics, heavy equipment technicians, housing maintainers, millwrights, plumbers, and welders.



Once hired, they go through a four-month pre-trades program at Site that includes: Essential skills training, job shadowing, and a pre-qualifier training to prepare them to take the apprenticeship entrance examination.

Once complete, the apprentices are indentured, and their four-year apprenticeship begins.






Driver Training – Class 7/5 and 3
